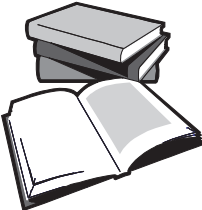


# Jesus enters Jerusalem

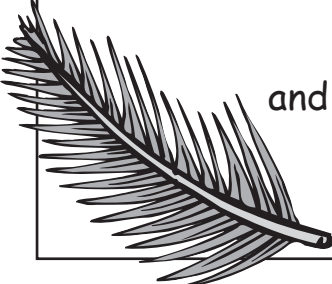


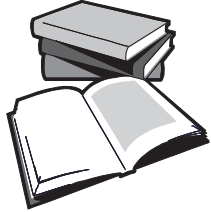
Read Matthew chapter 21 verses 1-11.

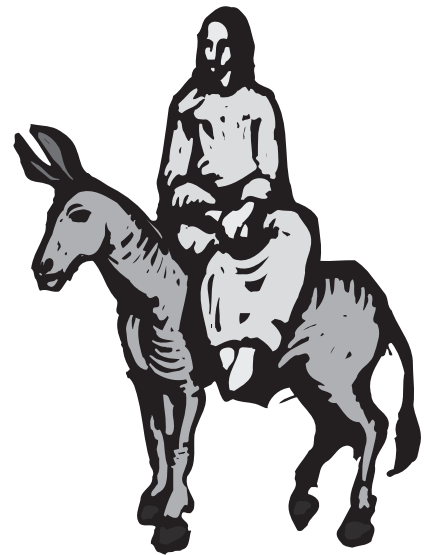

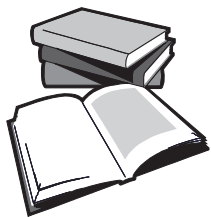

# Praise to David's son

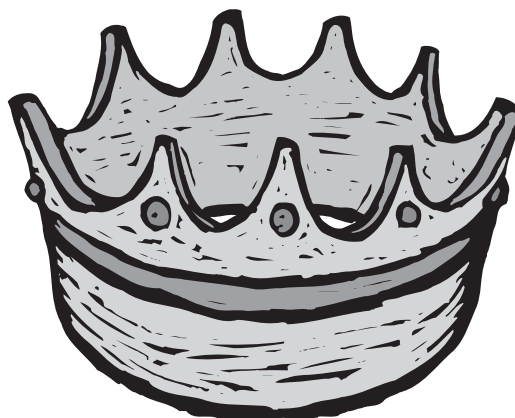


By calling Jesus 'David's Son' the people showed that they believed he was the special one sent by God - the **Messiah**.
