WALKING DEBATE



Ask all the pupils to stand in the middle of the room.



The middle of the room is the **neutral** area.


The left of the room is the **strongly disagree** area.

The right of the room is the **strongly agree** area.

Each time you call out one of the following statements, pupils must respond by moving either to the left or the right of the room.

If they are unsure, they can remain in the neutral area. They can also move a little to the left or to the right, depending on how strong their opinion is.

- 1. Men are better drivers than women.
- 2. Girls are more emotional than boys.
- 3. Real men don't cry.
- 4. Girls are more mature than boys.
- 5. Boys are physically stronger than girls.
- 6. Girls are no good at sport.
- 7. Boys are more aggressive than girls.
- 8. It is a woman's role to clean the home and cook meals for her family.
- 9. Women should not be allowed to fight in a war.
- 10. Boys are afraid of clever girls.



After each question the teacher may ask for volunteers to justify their decision. If they wish, pupils can try to persuade someone from the opposite side to change their opinion.


